TVIH Board Meeting March 23, 2022

Finances- Peter Brunner

Pete expressed concern about future finances. Our dues structure does not completely support our staffing, rental, and other needs. We are running at an annual deficit of about \$20,000. We will be OK for the next two years but will need to use that time to get additional funding. He will be looking at the financial structure of other villages in the Village to Village network for ideas and for information about their dues structure to determine whether ours may need to be modified. Another option to help navigate that deficit is business sponsorships.

Website update/TVIH survey on reopening events to in-person participation (Fran Dummett)

Fran met with Application Research Laboratory (ARL) high school students to generate potential designs for a new logo. On 4/4 at 8 am the students will present possible logo designs. Volunteers are welcome to join Fran D. in looking at the new logo with the ARL students. Nancy Freeman has also drawn a new logo design. All these suggestions will be shown on 4/13 during Good Morning Howard.

At the same GMH session, planned changes to the TVIH website and the responses to the TVIH survey, will be discussed. The website redesign will streamline the website so it is easier to navigate for members and potential members. The results of the survey which included questions on the logo, website and resumption of the TVIH activities will appear in the May newsletter.

Topic: Wine Tasting: Vertical tasting of Three Buccella Cabernet Sauvignons: 2009, 2011, 2012

A vertical wine tastings involves tasting different vintages of the same varietal wine from the same winery. For this Teach & Taste, participants will learn about terroir and how weather plays an important part of terroir. For the vertical tasting, we will taste three

wines from the famed Napa Valley winery Buccella. The word "Buccella" comes from Latin meaning mouthfeel. You will notice these cabs have a big, bold mouthfeel. The wines retail between \$142 and \$190 per bottle. Due to rising wine costs, fee for tasting is \$25.00 Host: Terry and Kathy Sullivan
